

- Mumias West, Kakamega County,
 Kenya
- Near Lake Victoria and the Equator
- Malaria endemic zone
- 4.8% rate of HIV positivity in Kakamega County
- 80% of the population aged 35 or below.
- **75**% of the rural population is involved in agriculture



Food Security Challenges


- •Rising malnutrition due to food insecurity
- •Poverty forces parents to leave children with relatives to seek work.
- •Small farms can't meet household needs, and climate change is driving crop failure.
- •High population density and large families increasing food insecurity






HEALTH AND TROPICAL DISEASES



- **HIV/AIDS**: Prevalence stands at **4.8%**, significantly impacting public health.
- Hepatitis B: A serious HIV co-infection; first local screening launched in 2024.
- Jiggers: A painful parasitic condition affecting feet; 250 people treated last year.
- Malaria: 50+ cases monthly, especially affecting children and pregnant women.
- Tuberculosis: A leading cause of death among people living with HIV.
- **Pregnancies:** 50 babies delivered each month. High rates of teenage pregnancy increasing youth vulnerability.





Jiggers


- Tunga penetrans (AKA also known as the jigger flea, chigoe, chigo, chigoe flea, chigo flea, nigua, sand flea, or burrowing flea
- Adult flea burrows into the host, engorges itself on blood expanding up to 80x. Expels eggs into the soil
- Treatment surgical extraction

OXFORD UNIVERSITY HOSPITALS & NASIO



- In partnership with **Oxford University Hospitals**, we've launched the **first free testing service** in Kakamega. We are closely working with
 - Dr Katie Jefferey Professor of Microbiology
 - Dr Louise Downs Wellcome-KEMRI fellow
- 900 tests completed to date, with 2 positive cases detected.
- Untreated Hepatitis B can lead to liver failure and cirrhosis.

A GLANCE AT OUR HIV PREVENTION PROGRAMME



- 154 active adult ART patients
- 14 infant patients on treatment

USAID FUNDING FREEZE AND UK CUTS

USAID Funding Freeze and Funding Cuts on HIV Care Globally:

- No access to HIV treatment due to disrupted supply chain
- Rising HIV Infections Delays in testing and prevention are fueling new cases
- Increased Infant Deaths No support for HIV-positive mothers puts babies at risk
- Increase in Tuberculosis and Malaria incidence due to lack of vaccines and medication
- Reduction in HIV research due to lack of funding
- Loss of jobs in the development sector



CLIMATE CHANGE AND ITS IMPACT


Increasing poverty:

- Estimated 1.1 million people living in poverty by 2050 due to climate change
- Decreasing household incomes
- Increasing food insecurity:
 - Decreasing agricultural yields leading to food insecurity
 - Increased youth vulnerability
- **Poor health outcomes:** increased the prevalence of diseases like malaria and waterborne illnesses. HIV cases are on the rise due to a lack of resources.



THE WALKER INSTITUTE, UNIVERSITY OF READING

- Regenerative Agriculture: Nasio is partnering with the Walker Institute to launch a regenerative farming project across various locations in Kenya.
- Climate Response: The project addresses the impact of climate change by restoring soil health and improving food security.
- Community Impact and Climate Resilience: Focuses on empowering smallholder farmers, especially women, with long-term, sustainable solutions.



THE WALKER INSTITUTE AND EVIDENCE FOR DEVELOPMENT

- Phase I of our programme used EfD's Individual Household Methodology (IHM) to assess livelihoods in Kakamega County.
- Findings showed **over 16% of households live in extreme poverty**, earning less than \$300 a year.
- This data will now guiding the Walker Institute's My Climate
 Risk framework to improve climate resilience
- We are designing context-specific regenerative agriculture solutions that meet local needs.
- This is will help Nasio improve agricultural practices in the community and increase incomes.
